## Addendum to Temporary and Permanent Fencing Plan

Dear Mike,

Further to the previously submitted and approved Temporary and Permanent Fencing Plan (Ref: 2505-SIE-ESI-D-TA-0002) submitted by our contractors, Siemens, in March 2018 to Discharge Requirement 9 (1,2 and 3) of the Triton Knoll Electrical System DCO, a requirement for two additional areas of permanent fencing have been identified in order to provide increased security from unauthorised entry onto adjacent farmland. This submission is for the approval of these two additional areas of permanent fencing which are supplemental to the previously approved scheme.

The reason for these two areas being required is due to historic occurrences of illegal access being taken by Hare Coursers onto adjacent farmland and the areas are shown on the enclosed plan ref: 2505-TKN-Z-YL-003962832-01 Permanent Fencing Plan.

The first area includes a length of approximately 90m of post and rail fencing and a low metal security gate around the entrance to our permanent access road off the A17, near Swineshead. The security gate has already been installed in consultation with the local farmer to a height to allow access into his field with harvesting equipment and a photo of the gate is included below. The proposed fencing is either side of the installed gate, in the location shown on the plan referenced above, which is proposed to be a wooden post and rail fence to highway specification as shown in the enclosed Highways Series Post and Rail Fencing Details Specification.

The second area of proposed permanent fencing is approximately 200m of post and wire fencing near to the Triton Knoll substation to mark a field boundary and discourage unauthorised entry onto the Triton Knoll permanent access road as shown on the enclosed plan. The fencing is proposed to be of standard agricultural specification with approximately 1m in height above ground wooden posts with 2 strands of metal wire in between.
