


FIREPLACES: Original late-18th C. (Georgian / Regency) fire surrounds and mantelpieces are present as noted on each plan. Some are blocked with lightweight board and it is likely that the grate or range is present - Refer to the Heritage Appraisal and Impact Assessment for photographs.

STAIRCASE & BANISTER: The staircase and banister from ground to second floor levels appears to be all of a piece (i.e. was all installed at once) and apparently original to the building (i.e. late-18th C. (Georgian / Regency) but possibly later (19th Century). It is wholly of wooden construction and the handrail has turned pine spindles and newels and hardwood handrails. All is painted gloss white. The turned detail is more complex and 'fine' on the lower flight and becomes progressively simpler towards the top of the building. - Refer to the HeritageAppraisal and Impact Assessment for photographs.

Original late-18th C. cast iron fire surround and cast iron range / grate intact and apparently functional. Inset hearth-stone present - See 'fireplaces' note above
