# WORKS TO TREES PROTECTED BY A TREE PRESERVATION ORDER

I refer to the above application, which was received by Boston Borough Council on 10-Mar-2023 and gives notice that you wish to undertake the following work as described on your application;

Application for works to trees subject to a tree preservation order (Boston no.12) to include:

T1 - Horsechestnut: Crown lift to 3.5m to provide clearance of private owners land at 65 Church Road, plus prune back by 1.5m to clear stree light, sever ivy to allow to die off

- T2 Lime: Remove dead wood and remove epicormic growth
- T3 Horsechestnut: Remove epicormic growth
- T4 Horsechestnut: Prune brances back by 1.5m to clear street light
- T5 Lime: Crown lift to 3.5m to rebalance tree (hanging over 65 Church Road)

In pursuance of their powers under the above mentioned Act and Regulations, Boston Borough Council as Local Planning Authority give consent for this proposal subject to the following conditions:-

- All works should be completed within two years of the date of this notice.
- This consent only allows for the identified works to be carried out once.
- All works should be carried out in accordance with the British Standard BS 3998:2010 Tree Work-Recommendations.
